- JWCC was awarded a \$3 million federal grant for the expansion of the Workforce Development Center in Quincy. Once completed, the project will provide relevant skill training for the most in-demand fields to the area's workforce and strengthen resiliency throughout the region.
- In partnership with JWCC, the University of Illinois and the Orr Corporation, construction is planned for a 24,000-square-foot facility at the JWCC Agricultural Education Center. The facility will include offices and classrooms, an exposition/arena space, and an animal care unit designed for short-term or temporary housing for the welfare of animals. The building will address multiple agricultural, education and development opportunities in the Tri-State area.

The last piece of good news for you is JWCC's 50th Anniversary is just around the corner. The 2023-24 academic year will be our celebratory year. More information to follow, but I want to invite you now to be a part of this historic year in the life of the College.

JWCC is YOUR path to the future. We hope you enjoy our community update. Each story in this publication is impactful and inspiring. Every person's journey is unique, and John Wood is here to help you achieve your dreams.

An inspiring personal blog from Melissa Hess, JWCC Adult Admissions Advisor

My job is to counsel adults who want to return to college or start for the first time. However, I have yet to graduate myself. I feel better now than I have in the past about my lack of a formal degree. It used to cause me embarrassment and I would cringe when conversations swirled around alma maters. Then, when my peers would find out I didn't have a college degree, I could see the surprise in their expressions. It hurt my confidence, a lot.

I went to college directly out of high school with top grades, joined a sorority, lived in a dorm, the whole thing. But after one semester, I decided to transfer back to a college in my hometown (even though the other college was only 25 minutes away). A combination of life circumstances, a relationship and my anxiety caused this abrupt shift. I stayed a semester in my hometown college but quickly lost interest and pulled out of that as well. In the end, the relationship I sacrificed for ended. The anxiety I experienced at that time lessened. The life circumstances surrounding it all improved.

Fast forward several years, a successful business was built with my partner at the time. We sold it for a generous profit to another company, but the partnership deteriorated and ultimately the relationship ended. I went to work at a non-profit then shifted to the community college I am at now. I had started taking classes while I was at the non-profit out of curiosity to see if I still "had it." Turns out, I kind of do. I am completing my associate degree in education with plans to move on to Eastern Illinois University

and earn my bachelor's in general study. The experience could not be more different than when I was younger, and the process moves at a much slower pace. The "barriers" to completion are plentiful. A full-time job, two amazing sons, one with special needs, time, money and more. They all gang up on me at times, so it's important for me to accept this isn't an easy, traditional, clean, and pretty journey. There will be struggle and it will be difficult.

I recently told my co-workers that when I finally graduate, I will wear my cap and gown all day. That's how much it means to me. I know the mountains I climbed, fell off, and remounted to earn this. I've felt the loneliness of parenting, working and being a student with no partner to share. I've lost my patience, more than once, and misaligned my priorities. I've given up 100 times and started again 101 times. I AM the students I counsel, and I will share my story because I'm not embarrassed of it anymore. The stigma my mind has imagined, doesn't exist. Adults going back to college is normal and moreover, commendable. To my students I am a classmate, a cheerleader, a sounding board, even a shoulder to cry on when the going gets tough; and it will get tough. How beautiful is that?

Rising to the Challenge

Josh and Krista Forbis became very familiar with the NICU in the hospital because all four of their children were born prematurely. Knowing what it's like to be a NICU parent, Krista could envision herself working as a nurse on that floor.

Josh and Krista didn't go to the same schools but met through sports in seventh grade. They live in Barry, IL and have been married since 2008. After high school, the couple both got their associate degrees at John Wood - Josh in law enforcement and Krista in the liberal arts. They later became interested in the college's nursing program. Deciding to go back to school with four children, this time would be different for sure, but Josh said to his wife, "I'll go... if you go!"

They both started the nursing program full-time, while Josh worked as an EMT in Pike County. Seeing a need for a nonemergency ambulance service, Josh and his business partner started Impact Medical Transport in 2020.

Going to school in 2020, a year of nothing but challenges, the couple was impressed with the creative ways the college utilized virtual clinicals. In a time of mostly virtual or online learning, Krista appreciated that, "All the classes I took online were fantastic."

They also encourage others to talk to Alisa Cameron from TRiO Student Support Services. Krista says, "Alisa is topnotch. One of the best people I've ever met! She has been a huge support system and has done so much for us."

Krista recently graduated, and Josh will do the same in two semesters. Reflecting on her experience, Krista says, "We saved a lot of money coming here. I feel like John Wood caters to non-traditional students a little more than a university does." Josh adds, "I like the smaller class sizes. They have great faculty that are willing to help. Overall, it's been a great experience."

Krista recently started working in Pittsfield as an RN in the emergency room at Illini Hospital. If she decides to pursue a position in the maternity unit in the future, she is grateful to know that she now has the foundation to continue to blaze her trail.

GRANT BOOSTS WORKFORCE TRAINING



After a year-long Campus Master Planning process, John Wood Community College's number one capital project identified was the expansion of the Workforce Development Center. A \$3 million Economic Development Administration Grant awarded to JWCC in June will help fund expansion of programs and facilities for this region to support the workforce needs of the Tri-State area.

"We continue to make investments for workforce training in the areas of manufacturing, transportation/logistics and many other career technical programs. The College is expanding our career education programs, and these training programs all require physical space to conduct hands-on training," said JWCC President Michael Elbe.

The project, which will begin in late 2021, will establish space for the new Automation and Robotics and Automotive Diesel Technology training programs; create an additional Truck Driver Training area; and expand other existing training programs.


EXPANDING OPPORTUNITY

More than 40 years ago, the Orr Research Center Corporation helped create the successful partnership between the University of Illinois and John Wood Community College at the Orr Center. This unique site has produced valuable on-site research and created educational opportunities for more than 1,000 JWCC students pursuing careers in agriculture.

The Orr Center's research, demonstration, and education efforts continue to impact farming and related agribusiness decisions today. The Orr Corporation is now leading a privately funded project to create a new 24,000-square-foot Multipurpose Agricultural Facility at JWCC's Agricultural Education Center near Baylis. This project will provide additional educational programs and services to address current and emerging agricultural industry opportunities and will improve human development and our rural economies. The \$2 million project is expected to begin this fall.

JWCC's 140 student-athletes overcame more than their opponents this year as they battled the pandemic.

Despite the obstacles COVID-19 threw into the mix, all eight teams competed this year, including a stretch where the Trail Blazers played in 176 games or matches in 113 days.

Along the way, the Men's Basketball and Esports programs garnered national recognition and multiple student-athletes snagged All-American, All-Academic, All-Region, All-Conference, and Dean's List honors.

JWCC Foundation


