- ♦ Additional accidental liability insurance is provided to each RSVP volunteer it covers you when you are traveling to and from a volunteer job and while you are volunteering.
- RSVP offers some mileage and meal reimbursement for volunteer travel to make volunteering an affordable option to those 55 and older.

Did You Know?

- ♦ There are 17 RSVP sites around the state of Illinois. Adams, Brown and Pike Counties RSVP is one of those sites. The next closest Illinois sites are in Springfield, Bloomington, and East St. Louis.
- There is an RSVP site in NE Missouri (Hannibal) and a site in SE Iowa (Lee County).
- Funding comes from AmeriCorps the federal agency responsible for national service, the Illinois Department on Aging, Adams County, United Way of Adams County, and United Way of Brown County.

New Philadelphia Adds Butterfly Garden, Pollinator Plot

Thanks to David and Kaye Iftner, butterflies could be coming to the New Philadelphia historic site founded in 1836 by Free Frank McWorter, the first African American to legally plat a town. The site, near Barry, IL, is under consideration to become a national park. A one-acre pollinator plot is slated to be done this fall.

"A lot of the decision about the national park will be based on the educational value to the community. This is just one more piece," Kaye said.

David sees educational benefits

reaching beyond just visitors to the site.

"Once we get the prairie pollinator part done, I'm going to keep an eye on it for what species of butterflies we're seeing," he said. "As a whole, the butterfly numbers in Pike County have probably gone down 60, 70%. That's not just the monarch. That's everything including the bees and flies and beetles that occur on these plants. They're all declining."
