Friendly Caller is a volunteer opportunity that can be done from your home. Depending on your availability and interest, you may call once or twice a week – or you might call five days a week. Volunteers will receive training. This program is designed to help address social isolation and loneliness. Volunteers will be matched with an individual to call. Do you know people who would benefit from a weekly call?
