Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a nationwide, non-profit organization dedicated to finding young children living without the luxury of sleeping on a bed or even laying their heads on a pillow. SHP's mission is to partner with organizations, businesses, and individuals to build beds, provide bedding, and deliver to kids in need. As the ONLY charity that builds hand-made bunk beds, SHP also gives children dignity, comfort, and peace of mind.

From 2012 to 2020, SHP has built and delivered 60,448 beds with the help of 94,620 volunteers from 242 chapters across the country. As our on-going Martin Luther King, Jr., Day of National Service (celebrated on January 17, 2022) project, Adams County RSVP will continue to collect bedding items for the Liberty, IL chapter of SHP.

Taxpayers with an annual household income under \$57,000 qualify for FREE tax filing services. Convenient daytime and evening appointments are available from February 1 through April 9.

Appointments are now being accepted. BOOK ONLINE TODAY.

Total annual household income of \$57,000 or under to qualify.

Required Information - MUST PROVIDE:

- O Photo identification (State ID, Drivers License, or Passport) for **YOU** and your **SPOUSE**.
- O Social Security cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) for **YOU**, your **SPOUSE**, your **DEPENDENTS**, and everyone included on your tax return.
- Birth dates for all on the tax return.
- O For married filing separate must have spouses name, date of birth, and Social Security number. If married filing jointly, both spouses must be present at time of signing.
- O All forms W-2, 1099, 1098, 1095A-Marketplace, EIP Notice 1444-C, Social Security verification statement, and any other tax documents for 2021.
- O Bank account and routing information if choosing direct deposit of refund (e.g. voided check).
- O Total paid to day care provider and their tax ID number.
- O Property tax receipt.
- O Letter 6419, Advance Child Tax Credit.



Current Scams

♦ Social Security Administration Imposter Scam

Social Security Administration imposters contact prospective victims by telephone and falsely claim that the victim's Social Security number has been suspended because of suspicious activity, or because it has been involved in a crime. They ask to confirm the victim's Social Security number, or they may say they need to withdraw money from the victim's bank and to store it on gift cards or in other unusual ways for "safekeeping." Victims may be told their accounts will be seized or frozen if they fail to act quickly. Perpetrators often use robocalls to reach victims. Victims may be told to "press 1" to speak to a government "support representative" for help reactivating their Social Security number. They also use caller ID spoofing to make it look like the Social Security Administration is calling. With such trickery, perpetrators convince victims to give up their Social Security numbers and other personal information.

♦ IRS Impostor Scam

IRS Imposter Scams are aggressive and sophisticated phone scam targeting taxpayers. Callers claim to be employees of the IRS, but are not. They use fake names and bogus IRS identification badge numbers. Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly through a wire transfer or stored value card such as a gift card. Victims who refuse to cooperate are threatened with arrest, deportation, or suspension of a business or driver's license.

♦ Tech Support Scam

Fraudsters make telephone calls and claim to be computer technicians associated with a well-known company or they may use internet pop-up messages to warn about non-existent computer problems. The scammers claim they have detected viruses, other malware, or hacking attempts on the victim's computer. They pretend to be "tech support" and ask that the victim give them remote access to his or her computer. Eventually, they diagnose a non-existent problem and ask the victim to pay large sums of money for unnecessary – or even harmful – services.

Refund scheme: After victims make payments, perpetrators often call back and offer refunds to victims, claiming their tech support services are no longer available. Perpetrators claim to send refund money to the victim's bank account but falsely claim that too much money was refunded. Perpetrators then induce victims to send payments (often through stored-value cards such as gift cards), purportedly to reimburse the tech support company for its "over-refund." Victims have lost hundreds or thousands of dollars to this refund scheme.
