HOW TO GET INFO. FROM ALEKS

- 1. Go to your class in ALEKS
- 2. Select Report/ALEKS Pie

Setting up Outcomes

Outcomes are created here to track mastery in a course. To get started, checkout the menu bar along the top. Click on the New Outcome button to create a new outcome, or the New Group button to create a new group to organize your outcomes into. More importantly, Canvas allows you to add outcomes to your grading rubrics so that you can evaluate mastery as you grade assignments. Once you've set up outcomes, click Manage Rubrics to start using your outcomes for grading.
