He decided to do something about it and approached the school and the police department about volunteering as a crossing guard. Ever since then, Newenham has been watching out for the kids at the elementary school, much to the community's relief.

Newenberg also circles the school in his truck three or four times a day to make sure no suspicious people are around. Don has lived in the area his whole life. "It's a little community, and I like that," he said. "My grandfather had a farm about six miles out of town, and I would walk to school."

Don expressed his love of children and that is why he does what he does. Whether it is the warm weather of spring or he dons his coveralls in winter, Don can always be seen at his post, smiling at the children of the community and keeping them safe.
