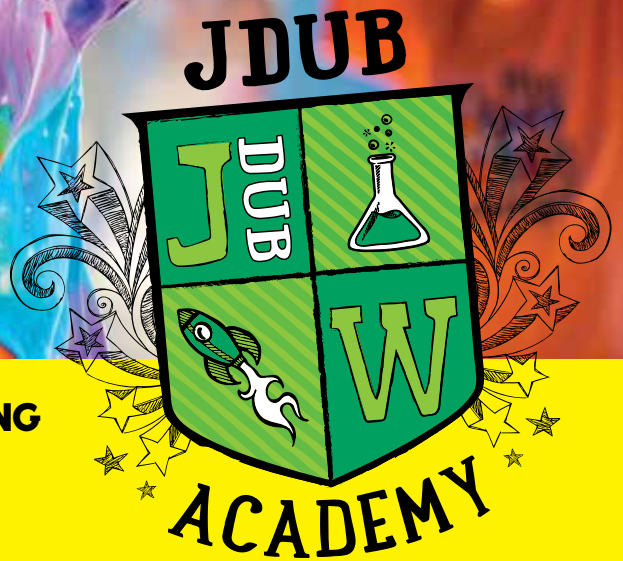

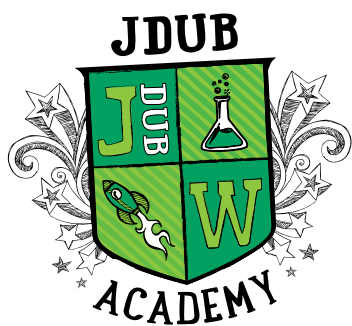

Drop Off/Pick Up: All classes that meet on the main campus will have students enter and exit through the Paul Heath Community Education and Fine Arts Center entrance. Students will be grouped by class in the lobby, and their instructor will walk with them to their classroom. We ask that a parent/guardian walk their child inside to meet with their class on the first day of each class. After that, parents can drop off/pick up outside the Paul Heath Community Education and Fine Arts Center entrance if they choose. A campus police officer will be on duty during regular drop-off/pick-up times. Children should arrive no earlier than 10 minutes before class and be picked up no later than 10 minutes after class. The beginning and end times of classes are listed on each course schedule.
